California's appellations are ideally influenced throughout the growing season by the unique climates created by the Pacific Ocean. The ethereal 'fog-like wave' on the label references the focus of DEEP SEA wines showcasing the impact of this natural cooling on some of California's most recognized maritime appellations.

Central Coast AVA

- Established in 1985 as California's second largest AVA
- Arroyo Grande Valley AVA is one of the numerous smaller AVAs location within
- Cooling coastal weather patterns and mineral rich soils planted primarily to Chardonnay and Rhône varieties

Monterey County

- Includes nine AVAs
- Established from 1982 to 2006
- Exemplary conditions for high quality, cool-climate viticulture

Santa Barbara County AVAs:

Santa Maria Valley AVA

- Established in 1981
- East-west orientation allows the cooling off-shore weather patterns to filter into the valley, which results in an extended growing season

Sta. Rita Hills AVA

- Established in 2001 and is a premier cool-climate viticultural region
- The Santa Rita Hills east-west positioning experiences the impact of ocean breezes due to their elevation and proximity to the coast

Los Carneros AVA

- Established in 1987 in Napa and Sonoma Counties
- Weather patterns that introduce fog and cool air-flow make for a mild average temperature in this prestigious AVA
- Cool-climate varieties develop a crisp acidity and moderate sugar levels
